Half of the year is gone and we are glad that we have made some progress on the objectives for 2022. It has been a great year so far working harder to reach more young people. With time we have come to observe that, students have taken the whole activity of doing Community Change Projects, passionately with so much dedication.

This year we have had an experience of getting calls of students doing Community Change Projects from districts, Great Hope Foundation don't have the government permission to work, as UWEZO AWARD project has not reached there yet. Great Hope Foundation (GHF) had to start working on permissions after these kind of information. This has been inspiring, pushing ourselves to find ways to reach more districts and make significant efforts to scale the project countrywide

UWEZO AWARD 2022 project is in great progress as up to the end of June, 250 schools had been reached, inspiring students to actively participate in UWEZO AWARD through Community Change Projects (CCPs). Almost 123 Secondary Schools had kicked off their CCPs. If all factors remain constant, then GHF goal of having at least 100 CCPs from the 224 Schools (our target) will be reached and significantly surpassed.













UWEZO AWARD is a signature project at Great Hope Foundation, where as students in Secondary Schools from Dar es Salaam, Coastal Region and Morogoro compete to design and implement entrepreneurial Community Change Projects that have positive impact to their community. Up to 2021, Great Hope Foundation had reached more than 620 Secondary Schools of the three regions, working with over 12,000 students since 2016.



What are the teachers saying about students' participation in UWEZO AWARD?

As we were documenting UWEZO AWARD 2021 Community Change Projects this year, we were able to hear some teachers, reflecting on what students have done on projects and what has been their observation. Some of them shared the following insights.

The entertainment activities that are created by students in UWEZO AWARD projects improves students daily attendance. Some of our students who have graduated and were part of UWEZO AWARD project have managed to employ themselves and they are getting income at their tender age. Generally we are very proud of the project, and it is amazing to see how the project is developing students talents".



What are the District/ Municipal Coordinators saying about their experience of Coordinating UWEZO AWARD 2022 project?




Timotheo Ibrahim

What happened on UWEZO CLUB TOUR for schools in Dar es Salaam?



After a successful visit of schools in Kibaha and Mkuranga, with UWEZO CLUB TOUR early March this year, we finalized the tour with schools in Dar es Salaam on 30th April, 2022. UWEZO CLUB TOUR, has been a seminar to students on how well they can do UWEZO AWARD projects and other associated activities.

Majority of schools in Dar es Salaam that are participating in UWEZO AWARD, gathered at Makongo Secondary School, the venue we were using for the training. It was a day of 4 hours of training with students.





Head of Monitoring and Evaluation; Rashid Huka, at Great Hope Foundation, gave a presentation (training) on how students can participate in UWEZO AWARD projects & UWEZO AWARD CHAIN projects, giving them hints, how can they come up with outstanding Community Change Projects.

Amos James who is the head the UWEZO CLUBS at Great Hope Foundation inspired students on how and why should they open UWEZO CLUBS in their school. He explained steps to register a club and the benefits of doing that. Justin Ntobi, who heads UWEZO APP (an online platform with content for students) gave a presentation on how to use the Application and why has the organization made efforts to develop the application and the future plan of it.

Juma Subeth, the head of UWEZO BONANZA inspired students to participate in UWEZO BONANZA 2022 and explained to students why has Great Hope Foundation, established UWEZO BONANZA, on top of UWEZO AWARD project.

Noelle Mahuvi, who is the Country Coordinator at Great Hope Foundation, inspired students to actively participate in UWEZO AWARD project, overcoming all challenges as it is a great opportunity for them to explore their potential and build skills.











What is happening with UWEZO BONANZA 2022?

Uwezo Bonanza is another project that was initiated in 2021, as a sister project to UWEZO AWARD and as part of UWEZO PROGRAM. In UWEZO BONANZA students compete to showcase their talents. Most of the time these talents fall in various categories of arts like; Drama, Drawing, Dancing, Acrobatics, Traditional Dancing etc.

This year Great Hope Foundation has expanded categories of participation from five (last year) to nine (this year). The Categories are as follows Dancing, Rapping, Singing, Drama, Fashion and Designing, Drawing, Traditional Dance, Acrobatic and Comedy.

Great Hope Foundation organized two talents screening, in 28th May, 2022 and 25th June, 2022 to see how students have prepared themselves for the competition and also giving them feedback on areas to improve. Many students from Dar es Salaam, Kibaha and Mkuranga Districts attended talent screening event, fully prepared.











projects far better than what they accomplished. I am not afraid of any school. I know all we need to do is put more efforts than others. We have so many projects, and for sure we shall win big this year.





At Tanzania Institute of Education, we met Dr. Anneth Komba, the Director General of TIE and Dr. Godson Lema, the Director of Innovation and Curriculum Development at TIE. After sharing the experiences and lessons we have accumulated for the six years of running UWEZO AWARD in the three regions of Dar es Salaam, Coastal Region and Morogoro, they were delighted with the innovation, effort and energy that goes with the project. They promised to advise the Government on how to scale the project countrywide and make see the feasibility of making this compulsory element to students at school.
