UWEZO AWARD 2021

UWEZO AWARD 2021, was quite special as it is for the first time that Great Hope Foundation, expanded the scope of the project to Morogoro Urban District. This has enabled Great Hope Foundation, to reach 224 Secondary schools in UWEZO AWARD 2021 from three regions; Dar es Salaam, Coastal and Morogoro.

Out of these schools, Great Hope Foundation received Community Change Project from 81 Secondary Schools. 46 Secondary Schools emerged winners in three Categories of Gold (six schools), Silver (24 schools) and Bronze (16 Schools). What a joy!!! With the increase of the projects that qualify for recognition, indicates that students are embracing learning entrepreneurship skills voluntarily and aim to be better year after year. They have found purpose in UWEZO AWARD.











The day of awarding Outstanding Community Change Projects, had come and as usual, we had to start the day by marching. It is the way we celebrate the hard-work done by students the whole year and getting ready for the Ceremony. "I am happy to be here and to see all of you. I would like to make sure each and everyone of you is very quiet before I speak. I am happy to hear that form one are here as well. When I was in form one I was almost the last student (actually second from last) in my examination. But in form four, I was the



second student (second from the top). Do you know what brought this change in me? Should I tell you?

I met a person who told me life is hard. Actually it is even very very hard without education. Second thing I was told was, it is actually a very good privilege to get into Secondary School and I needed to work very hard. If I were to repeat what I was told to you, this is what I would say, if in your education journey, your path doesn't have any challenges (its pain free or stress free) you could be in a very dangerous place/path.

You could be in the path of getting into the hard life I was told about. Life at school for a responsible student is normally hard. There is a verse in the bible I would like to quote "Njia ile ni nyembamba iendayo uzimani". Imagine 1.6M students get enrolled every year in standard one, but only around 60,000 do form six examination yearly. What has happened to the rest?

I would like to talk a bit about UWEZO AWARD, as your theme says... CHUKUA HATUA ONESHA UWEZO.

The world needs people with intelligence and capability. I remember in my teen years, apart from studying, I was singing (actually rap music). I used to write lyrics, in my books. By the time, I got into college I released my first song, titled NIAJE NI VIPI. My second song was GOOD BOY, which was followed by my third release UNANIPELEKA HI. That is when I started getting money and I paid my Masters tuition fees up to PHD. The money I got helped me to do a lot of things.

So I encourage you, don't drop any talent/skill you have. You will never know where it shall take you. I know we do have some people here who are musicians. Let me tell you this. Music is not better than education and education is not better than Music. Doing Music (in any way) is not enough reason for you to drop your school or doing school in a way that shouldn't make you drop your music. My music has made me Nikk wa Pili. But my education has

made me the District Commissioner for Kisarawe. Do you see?



I had prepared so much to talk, but most of it has been picked by the Guest of Honor, DC of Kisarawe,



In 2019, through my company we sponsored this program because we are passionate about what is happening with UWEZO AWARD.

I was a student like you, and I can openly say I have had several challenges on my path. I was privileged to have a family that took me to school. I can't say I had a difficult life, but there were some several challenges to overcome. Like our house didn't have electricity so I used kerosene lamps famously known as KOROBOI to study. At my friends house, they had electricity and so at times, I just found a reason to sleep there so that I can study comfortably, my father didn't like that, but I had to do it. Why did I do this. Because I knew what I wanted to achieve. I knew myself.

I urge you to take time and understand yourself. You can do this when you go take shower. When you are alone everyday, ask yourself, who am I and what do I want to achieve? When you ask yourself these questions, you will get some insights about yourself. Then check what you do everyday, does it take you to where you want to go or what you want to achieve?

My last word to you will be, discipline. Discipline is very important. What you do, the time you do it is very important. All you have to do and accomplish has to be done in appropriate time.



I am happy to be here to see all of you. First I would like to congratulate Great Hope Foundation for this great job, they are doing. You guys are getting an opportunity I never had when I was your age. I finished my O level studies in 2003 and my college 2010. You look surprised by that? Because you feel am of your age right? No, am a bit older, I am your big sister.



Since 2010, I chose to become an entrepreneur until today. You can see it has been 11 years. For those who are using Glory Sanitary Pads, I am the one who designed and created those pads. I remember last year, we recognized some of you who did very well in menstrual hygiene projects.

Am glad that am speaking after Nikki, Allen and others. All of them have spoken to us about life. This is my question to you, do you have dreams? Something big you want to achieve? I advise you to have your dreams and to write them down. These dreams shall guide you, which way to follow and what not to do. If I echo the words of the DC, "life is very hard". When you have these dreams, you shall know achieving them is not easy. Imagine how much time you spend at school. Getting to form six, you need at least 13 years. This isn't a small amount of time.

Some of you might end up in Form four, form six, college with a first degree etc. But goodluck for you is, opportunities like UWEZO AWARD, is preparing you to face the labor market, because you have learnt about entrepreneurship at this tender age. I have been among the panelist who

review your programs yearly. I have done this for four years actually. One thing that I have seen that is pretty obvious is, you have so much talents, passion and creativity. But unfortunately, there was no platform for you to bring out these talents. UWEZO AWARD has been a unique platform that has given you a chance to explore the package of your potential and develop it.

You have also heard your fellow, students who have used this platform effectively. They are now on different mission and activities because of the inspiration they have acquired through UWEZO AWARD. May this become an inspiration for you to follow their steps and never to give up. Giving up is a very bad enemy of your progress. Our President, first female President Samia Suluhu Hassan, if she had given up, she wouldn't have been our president today.

You can't become an expert on a certain area if you didn't overcome challenges. And for you

to overcome challenges, you need not to give up when they come. Those are my few remarks to you today. I hope for those who won't get trophies today, you will keep on trying harder next year, so that you get a trophy probably a better one.

1 KIBAHA SEC. SCHOOL - KIBAHA DISTRICT (COASTAL REGION)

We named our Community Change Project , **THE EAGLE'S EYE**. We started by doing a blood donation activity with the National Blood Transfusion Service. Then we started to raise fund through hair cutting (barber shop business), the money collected was used to buy vegetable seeds and we cultivated a garden. We collected more money by fixing calculators through El-craft solution project. Then we bought flowers and created a mortar stage at the parade area. The school donated sand and gravel for this renovation.

There after we borrowed a speaker which we used in conducting aerobic exercise which helped us in raising more funds and keeping us healthier considering the COVID-19 period. We organized a talent show (Kibaha Golden Premier) which was a way to raise more fund and promote student's talents. We harvested vegetables for the first time and sold them. Then we bought paint, vanish, paint brushes, red



oxide, timber and other carpentry tools for making and repairing 40 desks, to add number of desks in our school. We also made a suggestion box and a cupboard for student's government. We also bought steel wool and soap then cleaned the kitchen dishes and washing areas whose initial conditions were very poor and a threat to eruption of epidemics.

We used remaining paint to paint kerbs along the school entrance road and painted student trankers (bags made of steel) as a way of raising more fund. We taught other students on how to create websites and other software skills which are very essential in this world of science and technology. We bought metal sheets, solvents, vanish and iron rods for making posters which were used to provide necessary information and directions to students and school visitors.

Lastly we did another blood donation activity, this time we invited Muhimbili hospital (Mloganzila) where we donated 68 units which made total of 113 units (including the first blood donation). Our total fund raised for our Eagle's Eye Community Change Project was 1,619,000/=

2. WAL UL ASR BOYS SEMINARY SEC. SCHOOL – KIBAHA DISTRICT (COASTAL REGION)

The name of our Community Change was **GIVING A HEADSTART.** We aimed at bringing positive changes in our community. We managed to provide teachers with transport during Ramadan which were shared by two schools. We managed to donate food materials to ST. Katorosia Secondary School, as they had shortage of fund. We also conducted a diabetes seminar where over 250 people were tested, and only 7 tested positive for diabetes. Also we managed to donate 100 brushes, toothpastes, bathing soaps and cleaning handmade soaps. We managed to give graphics designing knowledge to Kibaha Hawza at a center where poor people come to study for free, this was to give him skills which he will be able to use in lif and earn some income.

We also managed to clean Mkoani Hospital on world environmental day for free. We organized ourselves to repair the mosque stairs, and we downloaded posters on diseases and printed them and then kept them at different places to raise awareness of various diseases. We gave counselling to orphans at Heaven of Peace on academic improvement cooperating with a teacher who has 15 years of experience in counselling. We also conducted entrepreneurship seminar on how to make soap to empower our society at our local area Kiluvya Mdukani. Total fund raised for our Community Change Project was 2,330,000 TZS.school."

3. TAMBAZA SEC. SCHOOL – ILALA CITY (DAR ES SALAAM)

The name of our Community Change Project was **GREENFRIENDS OF THE EARTH (GFE).** In our project, Members established a garden main aim was to ensure environment sustainability in the school. We also visited sick people and provided them soft drinks and donated blood so as to save lives of people who are in need of blood. Also we established a summit and theme was

Entrepreneurship to Youth whereby we invited experts and experienced people on entrepreneurship to share their experiences and educate us on different ways to link education with entrepreneurship skills. We also invited cancer department experts from Ocean Road Hospital so as to enlighten and raise awareness to students about Cancer in our school. We also organized students from our nearby school to attend a Times FM show which is called Students Center so as to showcase their singing talents. Also our team was able to attend the seminar and learned new advanced agricultural skills in farming, plus how to conduct a successful tomato business in the agricultural field at large.

We attended the grand opening of the FSBL competition that emphasized science students in linking their studies within solving different problems with the community. We visited the women's prison in Segerea to spend time with them and provided them sanitary towels and baby diapers. We also organized three days trip to Tanga during Easter short break to inspire youth to appreciate and help perpetuate the growth of domestic tourism. Not only that but also we organized a visit to the Al-Madina children home where we spent the whole day by playing with children, sharing little we had and having iftar with them. We also organized beach

restoration that aimed at ensuring beach safety also to encourage youths on environmental sustainability. The total fund raised for the project was 2,987,500 TZS.

4. AIRWING SEC. SCHOOL – ILALA (DAR ES SALAAM)

Our Community Change Project name was "GUNDUA TATIZO FANYA UTATUZI." We started by fundraising through various activities. We organized a talent show and we earned 40,500/=. We sold 100 bundles of vegetables and got 50,000/=. We went an extra mile by conducting entrepreneurship seminar through which we taught our fellow students how to make liquid soap and charcoal made by papers that added another business skills. After selling the two we got 60,000TZS and 22,000/= from both soap and charcoal respectively. We organized sport bonanza and managed to raise 30,000/=. We also we received 39,000/= as donation from our second master and 42,000/= earned from donation of club members. Therefore we were able to collect a total fund of 258,000/=

By knowing the challenge of unemployment we introduced "SHAMBA DARASA" through which students acquired skills about farming. We used 90,000/= to buy 6 sacks of limestone which we used to paint stones beside the garden all over our school compound. We bought raw materials for soap which costed 47,000/= and made liquid soap ourselves that was used in cleaning program at Rugambwa Hospital located at Madafu Gongo la Mboto Road. Also it was used in cleaning toilets of Airwing Primary School. We used 28,000/= to buy paint which was used to repaint 400 chairs to prevent them from rusting. We also conducted a debate and broadcasted it through TBC Television which we discussed the solution of a major problem in our country. Poor performance of students in science subjects. We activated the school dam of which we now use to keep fish for specimen and also increased the number of rats we grow from 200 to 384 which are used for

laboratory experiments. We also cleaned the street chamber (Banana) to prevent mosquito habitating and decrease the spread of diseases. Also we invited NHIF to provide education on the importance of insurance and also we were able donate about 10500 ML of blood from 32 students.

5. JUHUDI SEC. SCHOOL – ILALA (DAR ES SALAAM)

The name of our Community Change Project was **SISI NI JAMII**. Our project started by fund raising which was done by making charcoal out of paper and we were able to raise 11,500/=. We used that money to buy four bottles of liquid soap each for 1000/=and sold them to our teacher for 2500/= per each. Our club members contributed 20,000 /= The money which was used to construct a hut for shoeshine and book repair.

Also we started a school league which needed around 50,000/= for preparation and through that we raised 80,000/= where as 30,000/= was profit. Also we conducted a talent day which needed around 20,000/= to organize and it raised around 67,000/= We were able to bring Tumaini Media on talent day so as to expose our talent on Television. We also used 17,500/= to prepare a seminar which gave us 77,500/=. From all activities we managed to acquire 223,600/=. We used the fund to repair different stuffs in our school compound like; blackboard, water tap in girls' toilet, windows, academic office, and the rest of the money was used to buy tires for canteen expansion.

We also visited MRC Sober house at Kigamboni so as to get education on the effect of drugs abuse and visited to 511 KJ of JWTZ at "Gongo la Mboto Mwisho wa Lami" where we learned on how to be patriotic in our country. Also we managed to do waste disposal project as well as blood donation at Kitonka Hospital where we donated 4 units of blood.

6. INSPIRE SEC. SCHOOL - KIBAHA DISTRICT (COASTAL REGION)

The name of our Community Change Project was **BEYOND OUR COMMUNITY.** As a group, we discussed and came up with the best way of fundraising on our project that included debate competitions, talent shows, making soap and traditional food (bago). Unfortunately we could not initiate debate competition as it required much time and we didn't have much of that. Therefore we based much on making soap and traditional food. We also organized a talent show but it did not look good as we had expected, however the talent show helped us to raise 140,000/=. The fund raised from making traditional food (Bago) was 73,000/= and also 80,000/= was raised from making soap. We asked teachers to contribute some amount and they gave us 40,000/= The contribution from our group members was 27,000/=

The money we got helped us to start our project where as we visited elders who are in need and with poor living conditions, we donated to them things like maize flour, sugar, mosquito nets, buckets, brooms, soaps, tea leaves, rice. We also participated in making environment clean for the reason of preventing diseases and creating good environment around elders houses. But also providing cleaning equipments to Mkoani Hospital Center such as brooms, mopes, buckets and soap together with provision of fruits and cleaning the toilets, wards, labor, laboratory and doctors officers. Lastly, we provided the prefects with badges at our school so as to make them more visible within our school and provided dustbins to each class for keeping the classrooms environment clean.

UNION FOR GOAL ACHIEVEMENT was the name of our Community Change Project. In our project we did different activities. We made liquid soap which helped us on fundraising by selling them to teachers and students. We used other soap for cleaning toilets in our school and washing our hands. We drew the map of Africa and East Africa historical sites and also drew the biological diagrams so as to help our teachers and students in learning. But we also labelled our school offices such as administration office, stuff office, academic offices, laboratory and girls' toilet.

We visited an orphanage center and we provided them some basic needs like 1 bag of flour, sets of sanitary pads, bites, packets of salts and clothes but also we spent time with them. Then we visited our district hospital (Mkuranga Hospital) where we provided them with cleanness facilities like soaps, toilet brushes and dustbins. Not only that but also we made charcoal out of paper as a way of reducing

cutting down trees and also for keeping our environment clean as we collected useless papers.

Also we reconstructed the road which was affected by soil erosion so as to simplify the people's transport. The last activity in our project was to conserve our Vianzi village environment by collecting useless bottles which we reused them on planting flowers and fruits plants. The total fund raised for the project was 222,400/=

8. INSPIRE SEC. SCHOOL - KIBAHA DISTRICT (COASTAL REGION)

The name of our Community Change was "VIJANA NI NGUVU KAZI". We started by raising fund where as we used our entrepreneurship skills to conduct small scale business and we were able to raise 131,000/=. Also we conducted talent show case which we named it as Awesome Concert and for one to see the show needed to pay entrance fee. We managed to get 120,000/= from students and teachers contributions. After this process of fund raising we managed to come up with 251,000/= as the total fund of our project.

We prepared and participated fully in social activities like visiting Mwendapole Dispensary and donated items like mattresses, bed sheets, Sanitizers together with cleaning equipments such as brooms, water soaps, toilet brush and mopes. On the other side in our school we provided education to the cooks on how cleanliness is directly proportional to our health and gave them aprons which enabled them to work in good condition.


