It is another season of the year, where **UWEZO BONANZA** had to happen. **UWEZO BONANZA** this year happened on 24th September and Great Hope Foundation was organizing this for the second time. **UWEZO BONANZA** is an event that brings together secondary school students, competing in showcasing their talents, which most of the time they are in form of arts (dancing, singing, drawing, acrobatics, drama etc).

The event was initiated by Great Hope Foundation, after receiving feedback from students, who desired to have such a platform apart from UWEZO AWARD. This event, brought together over 2000 students from Dar es Salaam and Coastal region who competed heavily on seven categories in showcasing their talents.

The **UWEZO BONANZA** event of 2021 was held at DUCE (Dar es Salaam University College of Education) on 14th October bringing together over 1000 students from Secondary Schools of Dar es salaam and Coastal region.

UWEZO BONANZA project aims at giving students a platform to showcase their talents as a way of encouraging them to nurture and develop these talents alongside their studies, so that as they get out of learning institutions, they might be able to use these talents in fighting high level of unemployment they face on the market





























HOW DID UWEZO BONANZA 2022 START?

UWEZO BONANZA 2022, started by asking all students who have talents and passion of participating in the event to send their videos to GHF, with all types of talents/activities they wish to showcase. The deadline for this was 12th March, 2022. The videos went through the first screening, and the second screening which was physical was arranged on 28th May, 2022 and the third one was on 25th June, 2022. Both second and third screening were done at Makongo Secondary School. From these screenings, groups were identified who came to compete on grand the finale. There were some dropouts along the way, but at the end of all screening, GHF got groups that would participate in seven categories; dancing, drama, drawing, fashion show, rapping, singing and traditional dancing



The top most winner in Drawing Category: Kichanga S.S (Temeke Municipal)

The first trophy and a 300,000/= TZS cheque went to Hassan Mohammed from Kichanga Secondary School followed by Silvester Pascal from Juhudi Secondary School. The top most winner in Traditional Dancing: Kichanga Secondary School (Temeke Municipal)

In traditional dancing category the trophy and 300,000/- TZS cheque was given to Kichanga Secondary School followed by the second winner from Kondo Secondary School. Kichanga Secondary school made a record of taking two trophies (top most winners) in UWEZO BONANZA 2022. Both Drawing and Traditional dancing categories top trophies went to Kichanga Secondary School.

In Singing category the trophy and 300,000/= TZS cheque went to Tuliani Secondary School followed by Makoka, Victory, Makongo and Vianzi Secondary Schools.



"Our participation in UWEZO BONANZA 2022, has been our first experience and we are glad that we have won, in the singing category. We have got our trophy and our cheque of 300,000 TZS. I was highly inspired to participate in this event, when I heard about it at our school. Me and my friends, came together to form a team of nine people.


