UWEZO PROGRAM 2022

With a lot that has happened at the UWEZO PROGRAM 2022, finally the ceremony was successfully conducted despite the challenges in schools' calendars and the stress of organizing two events in the same year in a short period: UWEZO BONANZA & UWEZO AWARD Ceremony. UWEZO AWARD Ceremony 2022 was held on 10th December 2022, and Great Hope Foundation (GHF) has successfully organized it for 7 years since 2016.

UWEZO AWARD project is a yearly competition organized by GHF, inspiring students to design community Change Projects that carry three elements; a chance to explore their talents/potential, acquire skills and bring positive impact to their communities through their projects. These are the evaluation criteria in assessing the projects that students will carry out. Outstanding Community Change Projects are recognized and awarded yearly by the Great Hope Foundation. UWEZO AWARD 2022 involved 10 Municipals from Dar es Salaam and Coastal Region (Bagamoyo, Ilala, Kibaha, Kigamboni, Kinondoni, Mkuranga, Kibiti, Kisarawe, Temeke, and Ubungu) and a total of 250 Secondary Schools were encouraged to participate in UWEZO AWARD project. Out of these, 33 Schools' Community Change Projects were recognized on three levels; Gold, Silver, and Bronze.

It was held at the University of Dar es Salaam, with the District Commissioner of Ubungu District, Kheri James as the Guest of Honor. The event had the privilege of having a representative from the Commissioner of Education's office Ministry of Education. It also had different guests and stakeholders from governmental and non-governmental organizations, including Mzumbe University.

UWEZO AWARD 2022 PARTNERS

GHF has worked with different partners and stakeholders to make UWEZO AWARD 2022 a success, with SEGAL FAMILY FOUNDATION and KARIMJEE JIVANJEE FOUNDATION being the main partners. We were also happy to work with TVE/EFM media as the first media house to partner with. Premier Agencies has also been a long time partner for UWEZO AWARD. We are very appreciative!

HOW DID UWEZO AWARD CEREMONY 2022 START ?

The event started by students marching from Magufuli Hostels to YOMBO 4 Hall at University of Dar es Salaam (UDSM). Students met at 7 am with the brass band, police, and some GHF coordinators ready to march from the hostels to the venue. More than 200 students participated in the marching. This has been a tradition, to celebrate and make the community aware of the role of young people in bringing change in society when they are given a chance and platform to showcase their full potential.

Students arrived at the venue and started registering to enter the hall, ready to kick off the event officially. More than 1500 students registered from different schools in Dar es Salaam and Coastal regions, although schools were closed then.

The event was officially opened at 11 am, and kicked off with opening remarks from the Country Director, Miss Noelle Mahuvi. She shared her views and comments in regarding UWEZO AWARD 2022 project as below.

Country Director, Miss Noelle Mahuvi



"I would like to welcome a representative of the Minister of Education , Alfred Mkenda as one of our special guests today. He is from the Institute of Adult Education, his name is Mr. Aristarick Lekulle. I would like all of us to stand up as we welcome Honorable District Commissioner of Ubungu District, Kheri James as he is coming in. Please welcome him. Despite his many duties and responsibilities; he still set aside time to participate in the 7th UWEZO AWARD CEREMONY. Thank you so much. I also want to recognize our stakeholders, role models, (Samson Ndosi and Mercy Kitomari), teachers, and guests; please wave! Let us congratulate the teachers again as apart from their work they have devoted themselves to volunteering and supporting students in their projects—special thanks to you teachers. Also, I would like to recognize your presence, students from ILALA, KINONDONI, TEMEKE, UBUNGO, KIBAHA, KISARAWA, MKURANGA, KIBITI. I would also like to recognize our partners, SEGAL FAMILY FOUNDATION, KARIMJEE JIVANJEE FOUNDATION, PREMIER AGENCIES, and TVE. Today is the UWEZO AWARD CEREMONY 2022 for the 7th time. Let's congratulate ourselves. What a milestone! Some students have participated in UWEZO AWARD for the 6th time as they started since they were in Form 1 up to Form 6, some for 2 years, 3,4, others 5 years. This year due to the Census, students were required to finish their studies sooner, and UWEZO AWARD was not a priority, but despite such challenges some students chose to finish their UWEZO AWARD projects. Congratulations!"



Why are we holding the UWEZO AWARD for the 7th consecutive year? There are two main objectives; firstly, the project teaches you to become an entrepreneur in all aspects of life, but

also to be able to recognize the ability you have, which isn't mostly seen in class. If you know Commerce, Mathematics, Biology you will get an "A" in class. But when you are a great leader, influencer, and motivator in class, such talents cannot be seen in class, but in the employment industry, with such skills, you might get a good job. For instance, when you are in class and making noise, you are considered a noise maker, but when you are outside, you might be a good Master of Ceremony. I know one of the best MCs in Tanzania who is paid Tsh 3.5 million per single event. So if you polish your talent for making noise, you might use it to create a great job. So, UWEZO PROGRAM aims to encourage you to use your talent and ability to learn entrepreneurship but also soft skills, such as teamwork, creativity, communication, and confidence. These soft skills are not taught in schools, but when you get into the employment industry. They are very crucial.

This year we were able to hold the UWEZO BONANZA for the second time. How many of you were in UWEZO BONANZA? Almost all of you were there! UWEZO BONANZA is a twin project that showcases talents like dance, singing, drama, and rapping, and the winner receives an award. The aim is to motivate students. If you have a talent in Art, you are encouraged to expose and polish it so that once you are out of school it can be used to create or provide work opportunities for employment.

This year UWEZO AWARD PROJECT has reached 250 schools, that's excellent news, and the other information is that schools that have successfully qualified for receiving awards are 33 schools. As usual, we are giving the Awards in three categories. The first is the upper level, the Gold trophy for an outstanding achievement. This year, we have two GOLD trophies. The second Award is a SILVER trophy, for which 12 schools qualified, and the third Award is the BRONZE trophy, for which 19 schools qualified, totaling 33 schools.



Please let me ask a question, who can tell me the qualification for awarding a winner, There are three primary qualifications, who can tell me?

"Then let me mention the qualifications. Firstly, we look at how your project has helped you to use the talents which you have (Potential development). Secondly, the project must give you skills (skills acquisition) and thirdly, the project must bring a positive impact in your community. So, those who will be given the Award today are the those who scored high on the three qualification.

The last thing that I would like to talk about is, this year we have established UWEZO CLUB. It has been challenging to explain to students about the clubs, but the purpose is to help you carry out sustainable projects. Also, your club could give you money that will help you carry out other big and sustainable projects. For those who could not register this year, You can register next year and make sure you succeed. I want to wish you all the best for those who will receive awards, all the best for those who will win, and all the best to those who successfully made it here. An Award motivates, but the most important thing is what you learned when you did the project. I always feel good to meet students who participated in UWEZO AWARD and have started businesses, enterprises, and organizations. It feels good that you learned something from UWEZO AWARD and are making use of the knowledge and skills".

GUEST OF HONOR SPEECH ON UWEZO AWARD CEREMONY 2022

Hon. Kheri James, the District Commissioner for Ubungo District, officiated the event as the Guest of honor. He encouraged on the engagement of students in these extra curriculum activities;



"First of all, I would like to congratulate all the stakeholders in this country who collaborate with the government in improving our education quality for every Tanzanian child. And today, I am happy to be in Ubungo, a District in which I have been given the task of managing development activities by the President, Her Excellency Samia Suluhu Hassan. This is a unique event that is being held primarily for students. I am so happy!"

As you know, right after our President of the United Republic of Tanzania came into power, she emphasized a lot on having an education system that prepares well a Tanzanian child. And you have heard that the institution responsible for preparing the Education curriculum has been gathering ideas for changing the curriculum by improving it, to give the Tanzanian child more skills and knowledge while in school.

GHF has organized again UWEZO AWARD CEREMONY for secondary school students through their UWEZO AWARD project. And this Ceremony is the seventh since they started this project, in 2016 with 20 schools only, but today they have reached 250 schools in Dar es Salaam and the Coastal Regions as well as Morogoro. Congratulations!

This project has been running to give students a platform to learn entrepreneurship in practice while still in school. Through this project, secondary school students should design and implement entrepreneurial projects, and the fund they earn is used to do social projects in the places they choose, especially the places in their schools' community.

Every year Great Hope Foundation collects projects from UWEZO AWARD students, and those who have done well are awarded. The main parameters that are looked in this project are; First of all, give students a chance to recognize their abilities, which are often not directly visible in the classroom. Second, the project should build students' skills. Third, the project should bring positive change in the society around them.

And here, I would like to congratulate this organization for its innovative project, carrying out the government's responsibility to prepare Tanzanians with knowledge and skills as specified in Tanzania's Education policy for 2014. Congratulations!

I am also thrilled to see that this year a total of more than 250 secondary schools were reached by the UWEZO AWARD project, and 33 schools have successfully met the criteria to get the Award. Prizes will be awarded in three levels: Top prizes for Gold (Outstanding Recognition - Gold Trophy) 2 schools, Silver Awards (Great Achievement - Silver Trophy) in 12 schools, and Bronze Awards (Good Achievement - Bronze Trophy) in 19 schools.

And here, I would like to give my recommendations to the principals, teachers, and parents. These extracurricular activities are not formalized in our curriculum, therefore I urge teachers, and principals, to allow students to participate and encourage them to work hard as what they learn, has a great contribution to building young people with knowledge and skills that will help them fight unemployment effectively on the job market.

This organization has started negotiations with the Tanzanian Education Institute as well as the ministry to see how this project can be part of the curriculum. I also ask teachers and parents to continue encouraging students to participate in the UWEZO AWARD project because it is beneficial to students, schools, and teachers. And finally, I encourage students to actively participate and do well, and if possible, all of you to get the highest quality award (i.e., Gold Trophy).

From the bottom of my heart, I would like to thank all the stakeholders who have collaborated with GREAT HOPE FOUNDATION in this project. KARIMJEE JIVANJEE FOUNDATION, SEGAL FAMILY FOUNDATION, TVE/EFM, and PREMIER AGENCIES. Your donations are very important in developing these young people and providing them with skills.

Finally, I wish all the best to all the students who've come to take their prizes. For those of you who will win awards, congratulations. If you miss an Award, try to get it next year. But most important is that which you have learned, especially in the area of entrepreneurship, use it in your life, let's see you as a great entrepreneur and let the nation be proud of you."



INSPIRATIONAL SPEECH ON UWEZO AWARD CEREMONY 2022



There was an inspirational speech from Costantine Magavilla who was Uwezo Award 2019 Role Model. He is an entrepreneur, public motivational speaker, author and also maintains a great interest of working with young people.

"I am very grateful to be here! My heartily appreciation to the organizers of the Ceremony. I am lucky that it is not my first time here.

Today I will talk from my own personal experience.

"Chukua Hatua Onesha Uwezo".

"I have been asked to speak about the importance of embracing entrepreneurship at a tender age. Theoretically there are three things I can talk about on the whole subject of entrepreneurship. Your spirit, character and your hustles. My aim is not to speak to you about entrepreneurship as a purely business subject, but I want to share with you entrepreneurial behavior. Because our character, is always built gradually, stepwise. One step after another.

Our character has three things; what you think, feel and do. These three components form your character. And the process of blending the three happens gradually, and you may not even notice it, but at the end, we have a complete character that is known, or even admired.

Life is amazing, and it will also amaze you in many ways. I came to learn that the things I learnt at school, only 5% of them were useful (I was able to use in my daily life). And there are people I thought, they were not capable of anything (they won't achieve much in life) and it was exactly the opposite with time.

Another thing that I want to share with you, is what I think a lot of young people are missing. The inability to differentiate between hustling (working hard to build something bigger) or struggles. Are you doing something that, is growing and getting bigger with time or your just having your daily struggles. For your to say you are hustling, you need three important things; right information, right knowledge and guidance. If you miss any of those, you can't say that your are hustling. You could be on your daily struggles and you are wasting your time.

Your education at this level, is quite basic. But it is important because it is building your humanity. One of the most important part of any human being is his/her spirit. The strength of your spirit matters in entrepreneurship. A very strong indication of a weak spirit is when you find yourselves, complaining on issues instead of solving them or bringing solutions.

Today I am going to donate a box of 80 books, that shall assist you in learning what I have briefed you today. Probably the great lesson on this book to you shall be, the realization that life is not about success or failure, it is about hustling. Hustling day in and day out.

You have to build yourselves up, so that you can successfully thrive on your daily hustles. And I am glad that, what you are doing in UWEZO AWARD, prepares you for that! This is an amazing platform. Allow me to congratulate all of you, for what you have done. Go out and do it so big. Be really hustlers! All the best! "



UWEZO AWARD 2022 ROLE MODELS SPEECH & RECOGNITION

Each year, GHF has been able to award competent people who have been successful in the spheres of business, leadership, and entrepreneurship to give a speech and inspire students on taking initiative in business and leadership. This year, GHF chose Mercy Kitomari and Samson Ndosi as our UWEZO AWARD 2022 ROLE MODELS

MERCY KITOMARI

Mercy Kitomari, a businesswoman in the food and beverage field. She produces ice cream, and distributes /sells ice cream in more than 10 supermarkets. She started selling ice cream in 2011 when she was 28 years old and from there onwards she never stopped. She learnt ice cream business from different famous chefs in the world, one of them from Italy. In Dar es Salaam she opened an ice cream business (Nelwa's Gelato) in 2013. She shared the following

"I realized that I started working on ice cream when I was in secondary. My mother used to keep cattle, goats, rabbits, and chicken and I was selling milk. I would take milk and mix it with sugar and freeze it. When my mother went to work, I would tell her that the milk spilt. But I was exchanging it with my friends for something I wanted. So, I came to realize that I started ice cream making a long time ago but I did not pay attention.

When I was growing up, I didn't know who I wanted to become and today I realize it wasn't a bad thing. It's not a bad idea not to know. Infact it could be really good because it helps you to be flexible. Sometimes if you want something and it doesn't happen, it can be a disappointment and it can break you.",

"I can say I have been a hustler since when I was young, I have sold a lot of things like peanuts, sausage, loaves of bread, rice, cassava, chapatti. I have always been a trader and it's a good thing if you are doing it. Keep it up. And from now on, track what you are selling. So for you who are just starting, even though it is a small business, open a bank account and start putting your profit. It does not matter how much it is. Even if it is 1000 or 1500 do not look down on such amount because you will need it later."

"At the university I took a Bachelor in Business Administration (BBA) and for my Master's Degree, I studied entrepreneurship. I was inspired to become an ice cream entrepreneur, through my tour guide job that i was doing after classes. I would take students to eat ice cream, and one day I thought to myself, Why do I take these students to eat ice cream? Cant I learn this business?, And why shouldn't I bring this business at home. I felt with my selling milk background, it should be easier. Then I started studying ice cream making online. I decided to volunteer in places where they sell ice cream. I did any job that would make me near an ice cream business, like washing dishes, opening and closing the store just to learn the ice cream business. Then I got a place where I worked for three months. He taught me how to do ice cream business, and when I got back home (came back here), before starting my ice cream business I was employed as a banker. But when I was a banker my mind was on ice cream. When you ask me what I do instead of saying I am a banker I would say I make the best ice cream in Tanzania. By then I hadn't started. Later, I decided to start selling Ice cream and I quit working, and here we are"

" In this business the biggest challenge is in the process of marketing, making people understand what is the good ice cream for their health. Many people don't have the knowledge of the quality of ice cream we make. But the joy I get is doing what I love, and bringing impact to society, through this business I have traveled to so many places and I got acknowledged because of the contribution I am making in my society."

"In supplying products to a supermarket, it does not matter if you are famous or not all they value is quality products and if you can supply. I want to let you know in the world of business fame does not help but the impact is what makes sense. If someone wants to do business with you, they decide basing on how much money they will make out of you and that's what matters to them. So, when I go to a supermarket my pitch has been, this is the price I am selling and this is what you will earn, and the fact they sell at higher margins like 50%, 60%, or 30% increases the value of my product and that's what I love."

"If i would define failure, i would say, who failed me in life, are human beings, People will fail you and at the same time will carry you to the top, all you need to decide is, who you are and what you value, and choose what is right for you, but people can fail you and support you at same time"

"My last word to you will be, when I was in secondary we did not have a platform like this where people come and speak to us. When I was studying there were a lot of HIV/AIDS campaigns. drama and so on but not these kinds of platforms. So you have the biggest opportunities I congratulate you. So, now you are young do not stress, and don't compare your life with the life of Instagram celebrities . You can't even compare yourselves with me, because something happened and it broke me then molded me several times to be who I am. So it is a process, do not compare your life with anyone's life just live your life. Also, you are the enemy of your life, do not blame anyone. To succeed and fail it's you to decide, the things you put in your head affects how you think and see life. The things you read and people you talk with, things you feed your brain with. The person you talk to, is your mind. Make sure you control it and it is not your mind controlling you."

Merci concluded by saying " It is okay to be a good human being because, in today's world, people praise those who speak ill of people. But being a good person will help you succeed in different things"





SAMSON NDOSSI

Samson is a visionary serial entrepreneur, businessman, financial market expert, transformational speaker, & author. Mr. Ndosi has passion and interest in start-ups, entrepreneurship, business, financial intelligence, leadership, & personal development.

He is currently a managing director of FUNDI@WORK, the fastest-growing company in repair, maintenance, & building facility management. He is also the Founder and Chairman of Belsam Group of Companies, & Managing Director of Centre For Personal Development, an organization founded to champion people to be their very best, be more successful in all they do, and live lives without regret, an organization committed to the personal reinvention and empowerment of people. He is also an author of articles on entrepreneurship, leadership, and personal development on various social media platforms.

These were his insights on the interview.

"I am the Chief Executive Officer at FUNDI @WORK company limited. I started working when I was in university in my second year. I had a friend who was working and at his office, there was a vacant. I accepted the work but the purpose was to get exposure and learn. So, during my free time, I would study and later work. I was paid 30,000 TZS per month and it was okay to me because my goal was not to get money but learn. Later I decided to quit working and started a business training center. After sometime I decided to go back to work since the business was not doing good. I worked as a procurement officer and after two years the contract ended. Then I worked into another company for almost year and later they fired me. It was a very difficult time for me as I needed that job very much at that time. This is when I decided to open my own company as I had learnt some skills from this employer."

"When I was in secondary school I had never thought I would become a businessman one day. My whole family members have been working for the government so my thoughts were I will also become a civil servant too."

"I have several hobbies, I love speaking, writing, and helping other people. On the business side I focused on bringing solutions to my clients. I realized that I can be more than who I think I am. I had learned a lot of things from my previous employer and I had some encouragement from old clients and came to a conclusion that I should just go and try to open my own company."

"As I speak today all the clients that used to be of my employer are now my clients and almost 70% of my workers who were there followed me. As we are speaking now, in 2022 February he closed the company as I had taken all the clients and workers because I was angry and got highly motivated to move on."

"I would like to advise you that you should not be inflexible with what you have studied. Be flexible and do anything. The good thing about business is, it gives you flexibility. And in business, there are"

two things; Technical and business. School only teaches you the technical part. But money is on business, for you to be a good teacher you must study teaching but to be a school owner you have to be a businessman.

KIBAHA SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT: "GIVE HOPE, SAVE BLUE, AND SPREAD GREEN".

"The name of our Community Change Project was GIVE HOPE, SAVE BLUE, AND SPREAD GREEN. We started by raising fund through duster making project and we succeeded to make 10 dusters which we sold to the school for TZS 20,000. We then conducted a Graphic designing class whereby we were able to teach logo making, brochures, banners, business card designing, advertising, and documentary of videos to 39 students and we were able to raise TZS 39,000.

Thereafter we conducted our phase one of blood donation . One was at Muhimbili Hospital, another was at Mloganzira hospital and we were able to collect 48 units. We also cleaned Tumbi CTC, as we helped to slash long grasses that surrounded and trim the bushes and flowers. Through the fund we had previously accumulated we were able to buy sockets and screws to cover the open socket and prevent electrical shocks that were likely to happen. We also managed to conduct a bites and snacks selling project during the UMISETA and managed to raise TZS 200,000 . Through this fund, we were able to visit Nyumbu secondary school to conduct our project known as "Kumthamini Mwanamke project" whereby we donated 70 bags of sanitary bags.

We were able to conduct a bottles campaign and collected 3000 bottles for three weeks whereby some bottles were used as decorations in our smart area and the rest were discarded. We then leased a grinding machine which we used to sharpen school cleaning equipment like slashers, hoes, axes, and scissors also we were able to sell Bracelets during the form six graduation, and on other days we were able to collect TZS 300,000. But we were also able to fix our teacher's computers and acquired TZS 20,000. In addition, we collected TZS 104,000 from 52 registration forms from new club members. Later, we visited Mkuza Girls' Secondary School, which suffered a tragic fire accident, and donated various learning materials. We also cleaned our school water tanks and brought water guards to purify our drinking water. We then planted 50 trees donated by one of our club members. Thereafter through our graphics and design class and we created and sold business cards and ID cards to our

fellow students and clubs and raised TZS 178,000. We got permission from the school and printed the logo on t-shirts and Tracksuit of form five students and raised TZS 630,000. Through these funds, we were able to buy cement bags which were used to repair Vimbweta and renovate the basketball court which was used for UMISETA games at district and regional levels. Then we conducted a charity event at Tumbi Hospital pediatric ward to bring hope to the sick children and provide them with several materials. lastly, we completed conducting our blood donation phase two where we acquired 56 units, making a total of 104 units. The total fund raised for the project was TZS 1,491,000. "

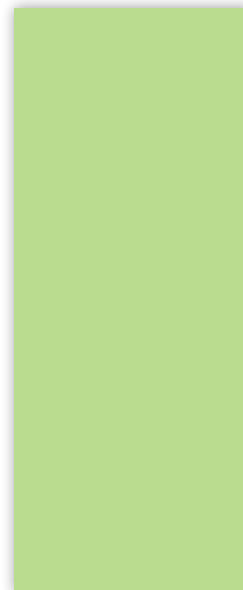
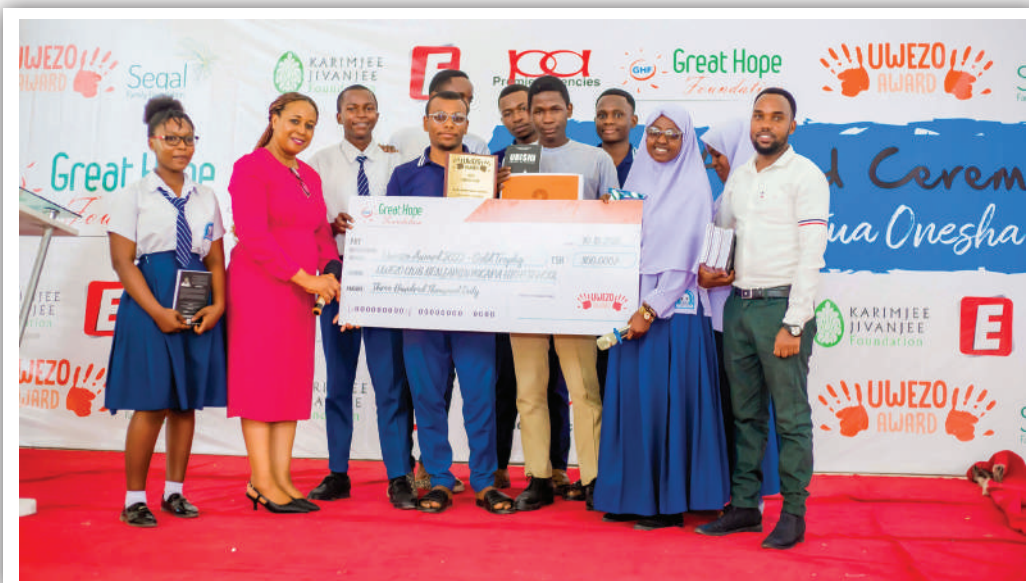
BENJAMIN W MKAPA SECONDARY SCHOOL**PROJECT: "CRESCENT MOON".**

"We started the Crescent Moon Project by contributing a small amount of money from all members and we started cultivating vegetables (Matembele Mekundu). We encountered a setback when the school administration decided that, there will be a construction of school Hall and Library and the canteen area shifted to our garden. Our project got destroyed. We decided to buy empty gallons and kept them on trees as our dustbins. Also, we collected empty bottles and filled them with water, and sold them. Then we fried Maandazi and sold them.

The money we raised enabled us to buy paints and other tools and painted some areas in our school administration area and scout office door. Then we prepared a movie show (cinema) at our school and we sold tickets and got more than TZS 100,000. With the money we collected, we decided to do a Chain Project where we constructed a floor on our school tape which helped easy movement of dirty water. Also, we made another floor with a slope which allowed water to flow to the school garden which has improved the growth of the garden. Also, the money obtained from Maandazi and compensation from Head Master for destroying our vegetable garden were used to buy different equipment and donated to the Juvenile Detention Center which is located at Upanga in Ilala (Dar es Salaam). We donated rice 10 kg, of petroleum jelly, underwear, candies, biscuits, pencils, rubbers, and seeds then we donated 70 units of blood.

Then we went to Uhuru Wasichana Primary school and provided gender education to the students and through cinema, we convinced students to conduct domestic tourism as we showed them a Royal Tour movie. Some students went to Bagamoyo Kaole then the profit we got was used to buy a few items that we donated to Ocean Road Cancer institute as a replacement for Matembele Mekundu which we had planned to donate and we planted at our school. We also bought tires and placed them in our school garden as decoration."

3. KIBITI HIGH SCHOOL

PROJECT: "YOUTH EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT".

"We named our Community Change Project "YOUTH EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT". We started raising fund through monetary contributions from 20 members and we were able to raise a total of TZS 100,000 .

After getting this amount we decided to make liquid soap and sold it to our school community, and people near our school. We earned a total amount of TZS 213,000 and after that, we introduced poultry farming chicken keeping by buying 110 eggs which provided a total of 81 chicks after six weeks we sold 40 chickens which were in the medium stage to continue supporting their feeding which included starter,

grower, and finisher which cost a total of TZS 146,000. After earning profit we started another project of keeping rats for our school experiments in which we started by buying a total of 31 mice @1000. We also did other projects to help support different campaigns such as Ant - Malaria and "CHANGIA DAMU OKOA MAISHA" in which we conducted blood donation by collecting a total of 116 units of blood from our fellow students.

We also conducted an "Anti-Corruption campaign " in which we raised awareness about the importance of fighting against corruption and illustrate the significance of proper utilization of public funds. For the Anti-Malaria campaign, we bought cleaning equipment such as 15 slashers TZS @15000, 2 spades TZS @10,000 and 5 hand hoes which helped in daily cleaning of the school environment to destroy mosquito and their incubating places.

We also provided education to people about finance, Self-liberation, and entrepreneurship which helped us to prepare a vegetable garden with our fellow students to remove the problem of malnutrition. The total fund raised was TZS 1,873,000 after the second phase of chicken farming which came with TZS 120,000 by selling 100 matured chicken TZS @12,000."

TAMBAZA SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT: "GREEN FRIENDS OF THE EARTH".

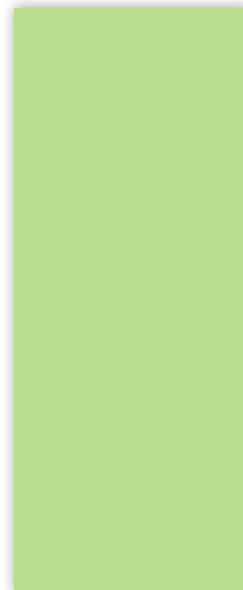
"Our Community Change Project name was GREEN FRIENDS OF THE EARTH. We started gardens at our school and the Tuyatunze campaign to ensure environmental sustainability in our school, we organized an inter-schools talent program where seventeen schools competed and students showcased their talents and also we were able to earn capital for running our entire project, we established a photo shoot with a theme, to ensure we acquire entrepreneurship skills and get capital to run our project and we invited experts to share their experience and educate us on ways to help link education with entrepreneurship skills.

Also, we organized training to enlighten and raise awareness among Tambaza and Jamhuri students on safe menstruation. We provided girls with sanitary towels and invited experts to share knowledge about safe menstruation.

We visited a women's Rehab center in Kigamboni to spend time with women recovering from drugs and learn from them the different ways a person can get into drug use. We were also able to share the little we had. We also organize blood donation. The project aimed to save the lives of people in need with blood and we promised to be good ambassadors of blood donation.

We visited BABIWA Children's Home where we spent a day playing with the kids and we were able to share the little we had. The team was able to attend the seminar and learned new advanced agricultural skills in farming, plus how to conduct a successful onion business in a large field. We organized students

from Tambaza and nearby schools to go to Times FM to showcase their singing talents on the program known as The Students Centre on Saturday from 11 am to 01 pm. We also organized training to raise awareness of the proper use of social media channels. And we organized 3 days trip to Kisarawe during the short break to inspire youth on domestic tourism."



5. VICTORY SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT: "UWEZO AWARD".

"Our Community Change Project name was UWEZO AWARD. We did a horticulture project to provide enough supply of vegetables to our school and enable students to get important nutrients. Also the general hygiene project we conducted to make the environment of the school clean and prevent the eruption of different diseases, apart from that we made soap which helped the school cleaning activities after getting the money we bought some equipment such as brooms, cobweb removers, dustbins, and others and we bought bulbs for students to study at nights.

On Chain Project, we dealt with the modification of football grounds which helped the school to prepare Bonanzas and inter-schools competitions. We also planted trees which helped to regulate the temperature at the school environment and ensured enough supply of clean air at school."



6.

JUHUDI SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT: "ABILITY FOR CHANGE".

"The name of our Community Change Project was ABILITY FOR CHANGE. We started our project by collecting donations from every member who contributed. Then we brought requirements for making liquid soap, and the profit obtained from the project was used to buy fertilizer for cultivating a vegetable garden.

We combined the amount we got and bought seeds and fertilizers for cultivating a vegetable garden and we combined the amount we got from the two projects to provide some services to the orphanage center and visit children living in jail at Upanga and at a school with children with disability (Mwarifu primary school).

We also expanded our capital by making liquid soap and selling it to teachers and students. The profit we got was used to make food and we sold it to raise more money. We decided to repair our school blackboards for all advanced classes and fix the toilet gates. We decided to put the gate as we felt it shall reduce the destruction of toilets water pipes and sinks. Then we conducted a blood donation with National Blood Bank. Also to keep our environment safe we decided to plant trees and conduct road safety training practically by helping children cross the road. We also distributed posters to spread education on road safety. We purchased curtains to prevent students from being directly hit by the sun.

Then we raised our funds again by establishing a cooking competition known as UWEZO FOOD COMPETITION (UFC). The income we got we used it constructing notice boards and direction signposts at our school. We also provided education about the importance of the census and environmental conservation and then we cleaned the Beach to prevent people from diseases and keep the ocean clean. Also, we provided education about entrepreneurship skills both practically and theoretically and then we cleaned school toilets and we provided some social assistance when needed like pushing broken cars."





7.

TEMEKE SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT: "THE OPEN ARMS SOCIETY TIME PROJECT (TOAST)".

"The name of our Community Change Project was THE OPEN ARMS SOCIETY TIME PROJECT (TOAST). The Project started when we donated blood through the "MPANGO WA TAIFA WA DAMU SALAMA". Then we went on to raise funds through club donations from each member, the money collected was used as start-up capital to buy seeds for our vegetable garden project and the rest of the money was used to buy sacks, needles, un-used clothes from tailors and collecting boxes to make doormats. We were able to make four doormats of which we sold for TZS 5000 each. The profit obtained from the doormats was used to buy ingredients for making cakes; flour, Vanilla flavor, eggs, baking powder, plastic bags, blue band, and icing sugar. After baking the cakes we sold them and collected funds. The fund collected this time was used to start community activities and projects. In our checklist, we started by buying brushes and paints for renovating our school canteen which was accomplished because of our determination and teamwork. Then we went to our next project where we asked every member to come up with a

single tree to plant around the school and we were able to collect 20 trees that were planted around June 2022. Then we bought 5 packets of powder soap and donated it to MRC (Muungano Recovery project) Sober house at Kigamboni. Then the following week after the project we attended a beach clean up at Kawe, where we were able to collect waste along the beach and leave it clean and beautiful. Also as a member of the KIGODA CHA MWALIMU NYERERE, we were able to attend the 13th Mwalimu J.K.Nyerere intellectuals festival where we learned more about self-reliance also some of our members got a chance to attend the Future Business Leaders Seminar (FSBL) where they learned on how to use science and innovation in business."



8. VIANZI SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT: "UNION FOR GOAL ACHIEVEMENT".

"The name of our Community Change Project was UNION FOR GOAL ACHIEVEMENT. We repaired Hostels for students to help students learn in a safe environment and also cleaned our school laboratory which helped students and teachers enjoy the learning process.

We also repaired some classrooms, improved dusters, and made dustbins. We also made posters for speaking English and direction of school buildings, repaired cleaning equipment such as slashers and panga, and also made a place for storing food utensils for hostel students.

We also repaired chairs and tables which will help students learn effectively and also added several desks in our school. We also volunteered at Vianzi primary school to draw pictures to assist students in the learning process. We prepared school walls, classrooms, and offices. We planted some trees to keep

the school environment beautiful and helping cleaning the gardens. We also provided soap, salt, and medicine to students who are living in a poor environment and decided to provide education about the importance of being part of UWEZO AWARD."

PROJECT: "UWEZO PROJECT FOR CHANGES IN OUR SCHOOL".

"The name of our Community Change Project was UWEZO PROJECT FOR CHANGES IN OUR SCHOOL. We first started our fundraising by organizing Bonanza which involved a football match and Talent show and we raised TZS 160,000. Then we collected plastic bottles after collecting them we sold and raised TZS 10,500. Then we made doormats and sold them and we raised TZS 50,000. Lastly, we made water soap and sold and we acquired TZS 60,000.

After fundraising and contribution from our teachers and scouts, we got TZS 350,500. As we had planned to repair our school emblem, vanishing the office doors, painting the gates and supply electricity to four classes, we continued with our plans. The electricity in four classes helped students who were coming early to get time to study and also to strengthen our school security. It also made the school look attractive and lastly we went to visit an Orphanage center."

MKUZA GIRLS SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT: "BEAUTY IS IN OUR HANDS".

"The name of our Community Change Project was BEAUTY IS IN OUR HANDS. We started our project with each member contributing TZS 2,000 then we continued raising fund by conducting different activities. We bought vegetables and green paper seeds using the money contributed by members and planted vegetables and we sold and got more fund.

Then we prepared a Bonanza and every student paid TZS 1000 The amount we got was used to buy creeping grasses. It was our first activity to be conducted with our own funds. After that, we cooked buns, Bagia, and Chutney which were sold to students where we got TZS 300,000. Through this amount, we bought timber, cement, and Vanish for kimbweta (Cement benches) making the project total cost to be TZS 171,000. We had a balance of TZS 168,600 for transportation on UWEZO AWARD CEREMONY and the capital for the next project."



PROJECT: "SAMBAZA TABASAMU, THAMINI UTU".

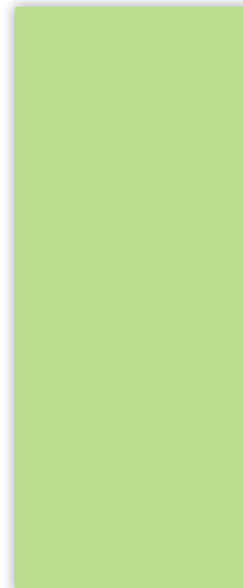
"The name of our Community Change Project was SAMBAZA TABASAMU, THAMINI UTU. We raised fund through four activities first through a talent show that gave us TZS 80,000. In total, we were able to raise TZS 160,000 through a talent show and by selling popcorn, soda, and juice with crisps.

The money we got was used to buy seeds for the vegetable garden and other requirements needed to cook buns. We also cultivated vegetables that helped to increase the fund to TZS 220,000 our Headmistress Sr. Soumya Jacob contributed to the project by buying bricks for the Carmelites triangle garden.

Third, through the fund, we were able to buy the facilities needed in making soap which cost TZS 52,000. Some of the soap was donated to Mkuranga Hospital other soap was sold at our school and to the parents during parents meeting on top of that through the remaining fund raised which was TZS 444,000. we conducted different projects like donation and cleaning the Hospital of Mkuranga district. Also, we donated soap, cleaning facilities of TZS 35,000, and also a donation to the Kisemvule primary school in Mkuranga district.

We donated dozen of books and compasses to the students for the amount of TZS 100,000. Donations to street children who live in a poor environment of amount to TZS 110,000. We bought cooking gloves for the cooks at our school which cost us TZS 15,000. We also donated to our young scholars who were having some challenges within the university of TZS 20,000 the aim of doing all of these was giving out the smile."





12. KISOTA SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT: "JIKUBALI OKOA JAMII".

"The name of our Community Change Project was JIKUBALI OKOA JAMII. We had two Community Change Projects. The first project involved developing gates for female toilets with assistance from the school administration.

The welder was found and inserted the gates to the doors. The launching event of the gates installation was done at our school and our Headmaster and the general secretary appreciated it a lot. Our second project involved visiting disabled people at Nunge located at Darajani (Mwalinu Nyerere) where we donated some basic needs to the children like 6kgs of rice, 2kgs of soap, 2kgs of sugar, and 2kgs of beans."

"The name of our Community Change Project was A NEW LEGACY. In our Community Change Project, we decided to conduct different activities on our community such as visiting orphans and we decided to visit one of the orphanage centers known as IJONGA ORPHANAGE CENTER located at Sinza Madukani to give hope to our fellow children, inspire them and give them company, sharing some ideas/thoughts plus donating some of their basic needs. All these activities were from UWEZO AWARD PROJECT and in our vegetable garden we managed to cultivate some vegetation such as tomatoes, spinach, peppers, Okras, and eggplant as it helped to reduce the costs of buying those ingredients for school."



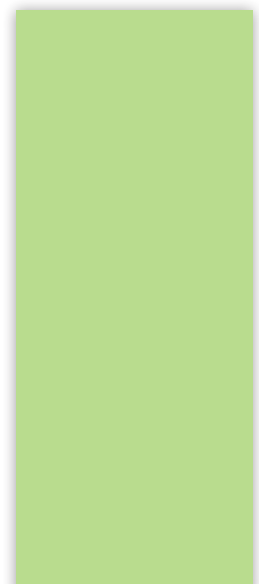

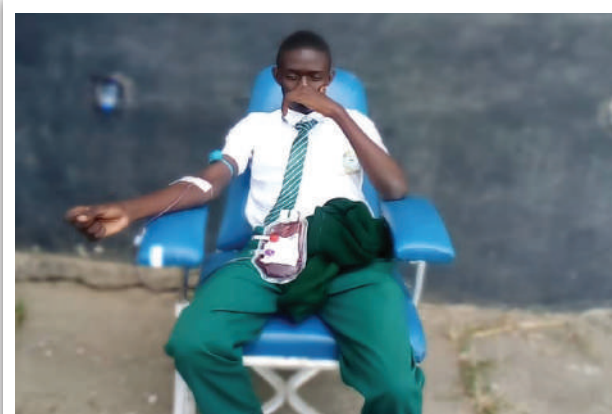

16. KONDO SECONDARY SCHOOL

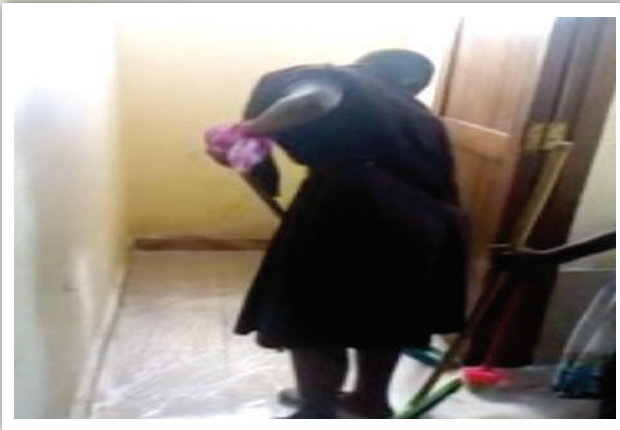
PROJECT: "HOSPITALITY TO OUR SOCIETY".

We started working on the project after buying the equipment that was needed like paints for painting, Gypsum powder, a roller brush, brush, kerosene oil, and a cycling board. The engineer taught us how to start and finish our upgrading project."

PROJECT: "RAIN OF HOPE".

"Our Community Change Project name was RAIN OF HOPE. We raised funds through a donation from the members of our club (20 students) and each member contributed TZS 2000 per month in total we were able to raise TZS 160,000 for three months. Donations from five teachers each giving TZS 5000 gave a total amount was TZS 25,000. We started a business selling vegetables and cassava. After selling cassavas and vegetables to students we got TZS 160,000.

We paid for music for talent show that cost us TZS 150,000. We paid TZS 5000 for pads which we donated to female students. We paid TZS 80,000 to buy quire four 4 counters books which we donated to female students who are living in difficult environment. Then we paid TZS 50,000 for buying seeds and vegetables. Cassavas and fertilizers and we paid TZS 10,000 for transportation of fuel and finally, we provided advice and counseling to our fellow youth and community in overcoming challenges."



PROJECT: "TABASAMU LAO NDIO THAMANI YETU".

"The name of our Community Change Project was TABASAMU LAO NDIO THAMANI YETU. In our Community Change Project, we aimed at providing school facilities that support effective education in government schools, that are in need (primary schools) such as exercise books, pencils, pens, and erasers. Also, we provided sanitary pads for girls in primary schools and this was done to make sure that girls were not forgotten in academic matters and they didn't have to stay at home just because they don't have pads during their periods to attend class comfortably.

Also, we tried to educate them to do all the things they wish to do in their careers. We raised fund through five activities; first contributed from each member and we got TZS 80,000. The second activity was a talent show whereby everyone showcased his or her talent and the entrance fee was TZS 1,000 for normal and TZS 2,000 for VIPs. We managed to collect TZS 96,000 after that we sold milk and got a balance of TZS 74,400 then we sold Stamina for TZS 300 each and got a balance of TZS 30,000, along with that we also sold buns and got a balance of TZS 18,000 TZS. Finally, Joseph who is our chairperson contributed TZS 10,000 and made a total balance of TZS 308,400"



PROJECT: "CREATING HARMONY ENVIRONMENT FOR EFFECTIVE LEARNING."

"The name of our Community Change Project was CREATING HARMONY ENVIRONMENT FOR EFFECTIVE LEARNING. This Community Change Project was done at our school. We accomplished the project, although we had different challenges. Later we were successful, and we started by making soap and sold it to the nearby schools and hospitals. The money we collected from our group members as membership fee was TZS 60,000. Then we sold some materials for making soap and some of the materials we made soap.

We donated some of the soap to school and the hospital to facilitate creating a clean harmonious environment in those areas.. And the amount of money that remained was used to buy trees and we planted them. The trees helped us in doing different experiments and they helped us with clean air circulation in our school. The other project was about the donation of blood which some students in our school participated. Then we prepared a school tour going to Bagamoyo through this tour we got some funds which helped us to build an office for guidance and counseling. We used the money to buy windows for TZS 330,000, wire mesh and door for TZS 200,000 and paints for TZS 120,000, and the payment for the constructors. All these projects were done for seven months."

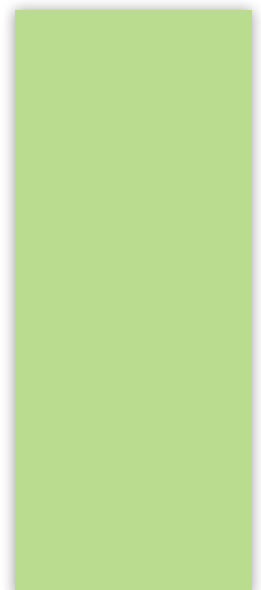

"The name of our Community Change Project was GREEN WORLD. Our Community Change Project this year was named GREEN WORLD whereby we planted different vegetables like spinach. First, we chose a good plot of land then we cleared the land to remove the weeds and after clearing the land we added fertilizer. After a few days, we went to plant seeds and started watering after a few weeks vegetables grew and we could see them. We used artificial fertilizers after some weeks vegetables were ready for harvesting.

This was continuous for two months and we sold vegetables to our school administration. A single batch was being sold at TZS 300 and we were able to sell 75 batches of vegetables after every two weeks. In total, we sold 300 batches of vegetables within 8 weeks. With the money that we got, we bought cleaning equipment for our school and we bought 12 brooms, 5 liters of liquid soap, moppers, and 1 big dustbin and this was our project for the year 2022."



PROJECT: "DO AND LEARN".

"The name of our Community Change Project was DO AND LEARN. We named our Community Change Project DO & LEARN because students were able to acquire new skills by doing different activities, we started our project in April and we used bottles to make decorations. We also conducted a charcoal-making project using wood but also we constructed a new East Africa map and we invited Lugalo Hospital for Blood donation whereby more than 75 students donated blood and 18000ml was collected. We are proud of what we did."

"The name of our Community Change Project was WE HEAL THE WORLD. Our project needed three weeks to accomplish and it aimed at healing the community in three specific fields. First in school by helping students get vegetables to get vitamin C as members were preparing orders.

"The name of our Community Change Project was OUR ENVIRONMENT OUR CAPITAL. Our target was to make maximum use of our environment by maximizing social welfare at a minimum financial cost. We started with a garden in the Smart Area Ground which was previously proven to be impossible to maintain due to soil infertility. We made some plans for changing the soil while others looked for flowers and grasses to plant.

We decided to divide ourselves into teams so as for everyone to specialize in a certain duty. While others were dealing with the garden, others should be making a strategy for incinerators. We also cleaned the Kunduchi ward office and we obtained some flowers for our garden. We collected bottles and sold them which made us obtain TZS 20,000. We also made an envelope-making seminar for students and we got TZS 25000 as an entrance fee. The amount was used to buy raw materials for envelopes and we made more than 1500 envelopes and we raised TZS 40,000."



PROJECT: "MAANDAZI AND SAMBUSA".

"First stage we raised fund by selling bits (Maandazi and Sambusa) to our fellow students which managed us to get enough fund to buy color paint, curtain, brash and kerosine oil. Then, we colored the room and also arranged books properly according to the name of subjects and classes This enabled students to access books easily."



PROJECT: "LABORATORY WATER SUPPLY".

"The name of our Community Change Project was LABORATORY WATER SUPPLY. The Project was about Supplying water from the school tank to the Laboratory to simplify all scientific experiments for all students who use the laboratory. The project started by contributing TZS 500 from 16 members of the group who were participating in the project, the total amount collected was TZS 8000 also one of the members decided to add TZS 2800. And the amount became TZS 10,800. The amount we had collected was used to buy 2kgs of peanuts for TZS 700 and sugar 1.5 kilograms @ TZS 2800 and TZS 1000 was used to buy charcoal.

These materials were used to make Kashata which in total cost TZS 14000 and as we sold them in four days we got a profit of TZS 56000. Then we made again and got TZS 18000 and the total became TZS 74000. The fund we raised, was used to buy 1 bag of cement which cost TZS 14500, water pipes @ TZS 18000, gate valves @ TZS 13000, Adaptor TZS 5000, Connector @ TZS 7000, welding iron @ TZS 10000 and seal tape TZS 2000. After that, we were able to build the stand and put the tank on the stand, and started to break the wall and put the pipe through the wall inside the laboratory. We were able to bring the pipes inside the laboratory and fixed all the pipes."



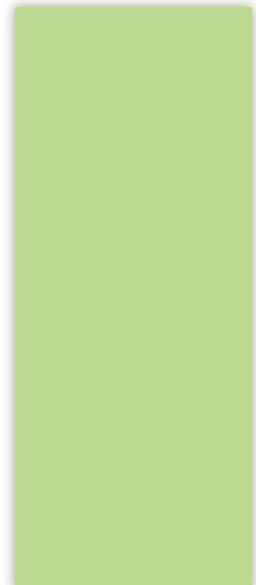

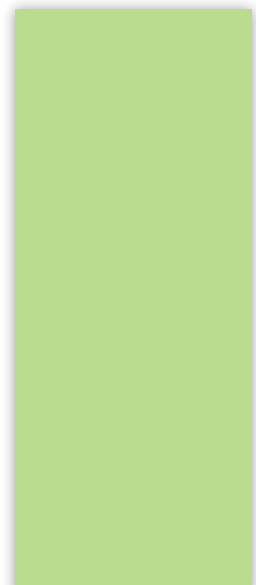

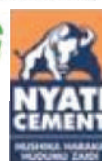
