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

It's our 5th anniversary ...!! Five years of empowering our young generation, equipping them with skills of the 21st Century through UWEZO AWARD project!! I thank God for the grace and energy that has enabled us to keep up the spirit, even during challenging times! Despite the hurdles, it has been a worthwhile journey. We are glad that we challenged ourselves to take this path.

We have been challenged by Covid 19, in 2020 that pushed UWEZO AWARD schedule to be done from July-October, instead of January to August like previous years. The timeline had to be reduced from six months to four months. However students took up the challenge, almost 70 Secondary Schools actively participated in UWEZO AWARD project by doing Community Change Projects. We were able to reach Mkuranga and

Kisarawe (Coastal Region) districts for the first time. And 35 Community Change Project from 35 Schools got recognized! What a milestone.

Since 2016, we worked with a total of 420+ Secondary Schools, of Dar es Salaam and Coastal Region, reaching over 420,000 students inspiring them to embrace entrepreneurship spirit at their tender age. Not only am proud of the number of young people we have touched, but also on how the project has evolved. We started with UWEZO AWARD project, but now we are adding other projects to develop UWEZO into a program. We are working on UWEZO APP, UWEZO CHAMPIONS and UWEZO FORUM. All of this projects are sister projects to UWEZO AWARD. These project have been developed after reflecting on the feedback students and teachers have been sharing yearly on UWEZO AWARD project.

I had a personal moment this year, when we were documenting students' Community Change Project of the previous years. I met students from Tungi Secondary School in Kigamboni (Dar es Salaam) who innovatively created charcoal using waste paper and clay soil. As they were narrating their stories and lesson learnt through their Community Change Project, one students said that he didn't know that his knowledge of making charcoal using clay soil would have been such a great business. He wanted to do the business during holiday season. I met another teacher at Chang'ombe Secondary School, who confessed that, attendance of the students has increased because of the extra curriculum activities that were done through UWEZO AWARD project. Stories like this, boosts our energy and our spirit to keep up this effort of organizing UWEZO AWARD yearly.

It is like every year, students remind us, of the reason that made us start the project. Their stories are quite powerful and the transformation they go through is quite extraordinary. I know UWEZO AWARD 2021 will be another great success. I couldn't have asked for a better job than this one!

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2020, Great Hope Foundation started implementing the 2020-2024 strategy of UWEZO AWARD. On the previous strategy of 2016-2019 UWEZO AWARD project objectives were as follows; First to create a platform where youth will acquire leadership skills(Practical Skills). Second to create a platform where youth will explore their talents/potential. Third to expose youths to community and social responsibility. Fourth to create a Mentorship Program that will facilitate skills development. And lastly to organize a yearly event "UWEZO AWARD CEREMONY" to recognize and award Outstanding Community Change Projects done

by students.

The implementation of the 2016-2019 strategy of UWEZO AWARD project, gave a clear outline of what should be the focal areas on the coming strategy. GHF observed that, by focusing on building entrepreneurship skills, it shall accommodate all other set of skills that are needed on the market place. The objectives of UWEZO AWARD project on the 2020-2024 were refined into the following

First to increase number of Community Change Projects (20% yearly) done in Secondary Schools as platforms for them to understand their potential/passion/drive/ability, build practical skills around that, understand entrepreneurial

opportunity in their Community and capitalize on them. Second to increase (25% yearly) number of Community Change Projects recognized by Great Hope Foundation and documented. Third to establish and increase training, coaching and Mentorship programs for students who have come up with Community Change outstanding Projects that can be incubated and accelerated at the market place. Lastly to establish and increase number of programs that facilitate in making UWEZO AWARD project sustainable and ready for scaling throughout the country.

Despite the hurdles of 2020 caused by Covid 19, Great Hope Foundation

managed to organize and run UWEZO AWARD project. 154 Secondary Schools were reached, and this is inclusive of the new two district that were added in 2020 which were Mkuranga and Kisarawe. Out of these 154 Secondary Schools, 35 were awarded as their Community Change Project qualified for recognition in three categories. Gold Trophy Catergory (3 schools), Silver Trophy Category (14 schools) and Bronze Category (18 schools).

Community Change Projects collected from 69 Secondary Schools had a composition of three basic activities as it was expected. 17 activities done on Community Change Projects were about Talent Exploration (creating platforms for students to showcase their talents). 45 activities were about skills acquisition (creating platforms for young people to acquire skills that are appropriate for the market place). 50 activities were about bringing positive impact to their community.


Generally there is a substantial increase and growth of UWEZO AWARD project in 2020 compared to 2019. For instance only 100 Secondary Schools were reached in 2019 but in 2020 154 Secondary Schools were reached for UWEZO AWARD project. Number of districts in 2019 were five but in 2020 there were seven. Number of schools that actively participated by doing Community Change Projects were 48 while in 2020 were 69. Number of Community Change Projects that got recognized in 2019 were 22 and 2020 were 35. Despite the hurdles that were mainly financial plus the global pandemic, we are glad that UWEZO AWARD has kept going and growing.







INTRODUCTION WHAT IS GHF



Great Hope Foundation (GHF) is a Non Governmental organization, registered in Tanzania mainland on July 26th 2010, with a registration number of 00003976. The inception of this organization was done by young people who had passion and drive of empowering young people of Tanzania in all possible ways to make them thrive on the labor market. This made the core thematic area of the organization to be young generation development and empowerment.


The organization, envision to become the leading organization in enlightening young generation potential in Africa. Great Hope Foundation mission is to design platforms that facilitate young people to acquire skills that enables them to thrive on the labor market either through self employment or securing descent employment on the market.

The first three years after inception, the organization team were preparing a lot of activities between students of various secondary schools. The programs that were organized aimed at assisting young people to value their potential specifically those that are not easily seen in class. In 2015, Great Hope Foundation designed an extensive program, UWEZO AWARD. The project was designed taking into consideration of all lessons and experiences that, GHF team was able to accumulate on the first three years. In 2016 July, Great Hope Foundation launched UWEZO AWARD project at MAKONGO Secondary School in Dar es Salaam with 20 secondary schools.











2. UWEZO AWARD PROJECT BACKGROUND

UWEZO AWARD project was designed to become an 'add on' to the Government's effort in improving the quality of education. Great Hope Foundation designed UWEZO AWARD project to facilitate in channeling students passion and interest in extra curriculum activities, that shall be an ingredient in building appropriate skills for the labor market. UWEZO AWARD aimed at re-packaging extra curriculum activities to become a platform for them to learn/acquire skills.

The set of soft skills acquired (boldness, confidence, creativity, innovativeness, teamwork, leadership etc) were expected to increase their competence in the labor market either through employment/self employment. Initially the plan was to introduce the project in Primary, Secondary schools and colleges. It was agreed to start with Secondary Schools.

UWEZO AWARD project is run as a competition between Secondary Schools. For the past five years, it has been organized in Secondary Schools of Dar es Salaam and Coastal region. To participate in the competition, students are required to organize and implement any Community Change Project of their choice. A single project should carry three aspects; should give students a chance to explore their potential (specifically those you can't easily see in class), acquire or build skills and lastly bring positive impact to their Community. Outstanding Community Change Projects, get awarded yearly by Great Hope Foundation. The awards aim at giving students inspiration to explore, value and develop their potential to the best possible way that can assist them to thrive in the market place.

Since 2016-2019, UWEZO AWARD project had five specific objectives; To create platforms for young people to explore their potential, acquire leadership



skills, instill in them social responsibility, awarding outstanding Community Change Projects and coaching & mentoring champions coming out of UWEZO AWARD project. In 2020, all these objectives were condensed to focus on building entrepreneurial skills to young people. Since 2016-2020, the project has reached over 420,000 students in Dar es Salaam and Coastal region

UWEZO AWARD PROJECT, 2020.

UWEZO AWARD 2020 kicked off in January 2020, where as District Coordinators from Great Hope Foundation started visiting Secondary Schools of Dar es Salaam and Coastal Region. At this time we had started processing for Permission for Kisarawe and Mkuranga district of Coastal Region so that to increase schools from 100 to 150 Secondary Schools.

The efforts were challenged by Covid 19, as all schools were closed in mid March to protect students from the Pandemic, COVID 19. As the government opened the schools end of June, 2020. Great Hope Foundation changed the timeline of the project. The project started in July to October, 2020. We reduced the time for the implementation of Community

Change projects from six to four months. The evaluation of all Community Change Projects was done early November, and on 12th December, 2020. GHF organized awarding ceremony for all schools that had qualified for recognition on three categories; Gold, Silver and Bronze.

On the current strategy of UWEZO AWARD 2020-2024, Great Hope Foundation refined the objectives of the project to focus on imparting students with entrepreneurship skills at their tender age. The objectives were refined to focus on entrepreneurship skills because, it was



observed that the set of those skills, have a broader impact on capacitating students to face the labor market aggressively with either descent employment or self employment.

The first objective in UWEZO AWARD 2020-2024 strategy is to increase number of Community Change Projects (20% yearly) done in Secondary Schools as platforms for them to understand their potential/ passion/drive/ability, build practical skills around that, understand entrepreneurial opportunities around their Community and capitalize on them. The second objective is to increase (25% yearly) number of Community Change Projects recognized by Great Hope Foundation and documented yearly.

The third objective is to establish and increase training, coaching and Mentorship programs for students who have come up with outstanding Community Change Projects (at least five yearly) that can be incubated and accelerated at the market place. And the fourth objective is to establish and increase number of programs that facilitate in making UWEZO AWARD project sustainable and ready for scaling. All these objectives were fairly achieved on UWEZO AWARD 2020 with the exception of the third objective that was highly challenged by resources and Covid 19.

The objectives enabled Great Hope Foundation to develop three strategic areas that carried activities for implementation. The first strategic area was Community Change Projects Initiation. Under this area several activities were done.







3.1 First strategic Area: Community Change Project Initiation

- First baseline survey was done by coordinators to identify Schools, and students' routine extra curriculum activities and their performance
- Through coordinators, Great Hope Foundation identified 154 Secondary Schools in the nine districts and Municipalities that were reached to participate in UA 2020. Through students clubs GHF coordinators inspired them to participate in UA 2020 project.
- 3. For all schools that agreed to participate in UA 2020, MoU was developed and signed (between Great Hope Foundation and school administration)
- 4. GHF coordinators inspired and trained students (building capacity) in implementing Community Change projects in UA 2020
- In Kisarawe and Mkuranga district, GHF reached the District education Officer for the permission to work with Secondary Schools of these two places. They collaboratively

- supported the project by giving permission to introduce UWEZO AWARD project in their areas.
- GHF coordinators were collecting feedback from students and teachers on their participation on UA 2020 through doing Community Change Projects
- 7. Weekly reports were collected from GHF coordinators by Monitoring and Evaluation team to ensure objectives and goals are met on UA 2020.



3.2 Second Strategic Area: Recognition of Outstanding Community Change Projects

On this area several activities were done. All Community Change Projects done by students were evaluated by a team of four Panelist. Here are the names.



The Community Change Projects were evaluated by looking into three basic elements. First, how has the Community Change Project been the platform for students to explore their potential. Second how has it assisted students to acquire skills and last how has it brought positive impact (significantly) to their Community. After evaluation, scores were grouped in three categories.

First was Gold Recognition (Gold Trophy) – this was given to outstanding Community Change Projects which scored 80%-100%. Three Community Change Projects from three (3) Schools qualified for this category

Second was Silver Recognition (Silver Trophy) – This was given to Community Change Projects that seemed to have Great Achievement, which scored 60%-79%. Fourteen (14) Community Change Projects from 14 Schools qualified for this category

Third was Bronze Recognition (Bronze Certificates) – This was given to projects that seemed to have an achievement that was average, which scored 51%-59%. Eighteen (18) Community Change Projects from 18 schools qualified for this category

All the 35 Schools, on the three categories were recognized with trophies and Certificates on UWEZO AWARD CEREMONY 2020 that was held at UDSM Hall on 12th December, 2020, on Saturday.

3.3 Third Strategic Area: Project Scaling and Sustainability

On this strategic area, several activities were done on UA 2020 to prepare the project for scaling and initiate the sustainability model for the project.

- A total of 30 documentaries of Community Change Projects of UWEZO AWARD 2018 and 2019 were recorded. These are produced to document what students' had done and achieved, but also to inspire students all over the country through these documentaries and build content for UWEZO APP.
- 2. Great Hope Foundation finalized the Development of UWEZO APP (android version) and WEB APP (for desktops), so as to enable people to stream the documentaries of Community Change Projects while donating to the project. By the end of December, the App had 9 documentaries of UWEZO AWARD 2017. 30 new documentaries were recorded from UWEZO AWARD 2018 & 2019. All will be added on UWEZO APP.
- Great Hope Foundation initiated some partnerships with Tanzania – DAMU SALAMA, to inspire students to do projects on blood donation as part of increasing their impact on their Community. Also there is a collaboration with KIJANI PAMOJA on inspiring students to plant and grow trees. This partnership will kick off in 2021.
- 4. Great Hope Foundation recruited 20 Volunteers in several units, trained them to ensure goals of UA 2020 are achieved.

3.4 Fourth Strategic Area: Coaching and Mentoring Outstanding Community Change Projects.

On this strategic Objective the goal was to develop coaching and mentoring program for students who come with outstanding Community Change Projects on UWEZO AWARD. Unfortunately this area was untouched because of the challenges associated with funds, and Covid 19. Much of this have been pushed on UWEZO AWARD 2021.

GOLD RECOGNITION (GOLD TROPHIES) – OUTSTANDING RECOGNITION

1. KIBAHA BOYS SECONDARY SCHOOL

"We named our project THE NEW ERA PROJECT. The aim of our project was to reduce fungal and stomach diseases at our school, improve hygiene by cleaning the water tanks, un blocking the bathroom drainage system, save the lives of pregnant mothers at Tumbi hospital by donating blood (we managed to donate about 9100ML from 26 students) and exploring students' talents.

We started by doing some fundraising whereas we repaired worn out shoes and we raised 13,000 TZS. Then we sold drawn pictures [6] and we earned 15,000 TZS. We hosted a Cultural Day at our school for students to get exposed in different cultures and we earned 274,000 TZS.

After collecting the fund we prepared a place where bites and vegetables can be sold at our school in a clean and safe environment. We planted 50 fruit trees which were donated by Tumbi Roman Catholic church as part of our environmental campaign which we started at our school in 2018 for the Uwezo Award."

2. BENJAMIN MKAPA SECONDARY SCHOOL

"We named our project THE POWER OF RESPONSE. In our project we started by fundraising through contributions from our 20 members earning 30,000 TZS. We hosted a talent show for students to showcase their talents and raised 152,000 TZS.

We washed some cars[15] which were packed in our parking lot and we earned 15,000 TZS. We sold vegetables to 15 teachers and we attained 75,000 TZS. We sold 38 frogs to form six students and we raised 38,000 TZS. We collected all the litters in our school compound and the papers were converted to charcoal and we sold them and raised 4.500 TZS.

We sold cakes and raised 87,000 TZS and in total we earned 334,000 TZS. After the collection of funds we visited Maunga Orphanage Centre and donated 1 sack of maize flour, 1 bar of soap, 1 bucket of Korie Cooking Oil, Exercice books and sanitary pads, We planted trees around our school area, We drew a picture of the late President Mkapa and made a school map for the guests direction and lastly we donated blood and raised awareness on the spread of Covid -19 and its prevention."

"We named our project CONSTRUCTING THE MOBILE BLACKBOARD. We started with our members contributions and we raised 20,000 TZS. Then we sold peanuts and we raised 10,000 TZS. We sold ubuyu (50 packets) and we raised 5,000 TZS.

Our teacher contributed 5,000 TZS. After collecting all the money we constructed a mobile blackboard. We had inadequate blackboards and classrooms at our school and by doing this it has created some conducive environment for students to learn and we know for sure our blackboard shall increase academic performance at our school."

"We named our project JOURNEY THROUGH OUR TALENTS, our project involved different activities like making some bracelets and paints and selling them. Then we had a school bonanza and an art exhibition and we raised 160,000 TZS.

After the fundraising activities we bought some cleaning equipment for our school such as brooms and brushes. Also we had a psychological, guidance and counseling to our fellow youth. We also donated blood and planted some trees around our school."

We named our project ENVIRONMENTAL MODIFICATION FOR GOOD HEALTH. We started by fundraising from our members then we cooked and sold 410 buns and 12 bottles of chilli sauce and we made a total of 53,000 TZS.

Second we made soaps and distributed to Watoto Wetu orphanage Centre. Then we organized a talent show and sold 300 tickets and we earned 300,000 TZS.

After completion of fundraising we bought cement, roll wires, angle bars to renovate the school fish pond, redecorated the school statue of BintiZanaki and later we bought Sanitary towels to be kept in the school dispensary and donated some stationeries to Watoto wetu Tanzania orphanage.

Our project touched SDGs goals 01, 02, 03, 04, 06, 08, 09, 11, 13,14,15 and 16.

Then we made biscuits, envelopes and liquid soaps and we sold them to our teachers and outside the school. We had contribution from members and we successfully made 244,000 TZS from all the fundraising activities.

We bought cleaning equipment for our school and we painted some of the school area."

"We named our project NOURISHMENT FOR THE NEEDY. Our project had many stages and among them involved fundraising. We started with donation from our teachers 90,000 TZS and students' contribution that was 130,000 TZS. Then we made and sold envelopes and we got 55,000 TZS. We hosted a talent show event and we raised 325,000 TZS.

The second stage involved using our fund (the one we have raised) to help the community. We bought buckets and liquid soaps for students to facilitate the prevention of Covid – 19. Then we visited Tumbi hospital and donated pads, toothpaste and soaps. Also we visited Green Pasture orphanage centre and donated some stationaries and food stuffs such as maize flour and sugar. Our last activity was cleaning Mlandizi market."

Also we started to cultivate a vegetable farm and after harvesting we sold and earned 70,000 TZ.

After the collection of the fund we decided to renovate our restroom for the sick people in our school and we bought beds, bed covers and bed sheets, pillows and curtains.

"We named our project BEN EVOLENT OUTWRITTERS (THE HELPING HAND). Our project managed to raise funds from several activities. First through club members contributions making a total of 200,000 TZS. 180,000 TZS was used to make 45 units of soaps and managed to sell 15 units and got a profit of 120,000 TZS.

The balance was used to buy one bucket of painting color of 25,000 TZS and painted the frog pond and the school benches. 30 frogs from the pond were sold to our school laboratories and raised 150,000. 100,000TZS was used to pay music system for the talent show and also students paid for an entrance fee for the show and we raised 150,000 TZS.

4,000 TZS was used to buy 10 bunches of lemon grass tea and planted them in school farms and 7 bunches were sold and raised 7,000 TZS. On top of that 42,000 TZS was used to pay transport fee to Moyo Mmoja orphanage centre at Bagamoyo.

After fundraising we bought cements and made flower pots and flower seeds and planted flowers In the flower pots that made us raise 70,000 TZS. The remaining amount of money was used to go buy some materials and donated them to an Orphanage Centre."

"We named our project YOUTH EDUCATION AND HEALTH AWARNESS. First we raised fund through donations from our members thus raising a total of 78,000 TZS. We also received donation from 5 teachers a total of 25,000 TZS. Also we organized an agriculture teaching session for 102 students and we raised 102,000 TZS. We also sold vegetables and cassavas as part of our fundraising and we got 47,2000 TZS thus summing up to 252,000 TZS.

We used the money to pay for music system for our talent show event and lastly we educated students on the effects of Covid -19 and raising awareness of reproductive health. Also lastly we bought cleaning facilities like brooms and dustbins and donated to Mwongozo Dispensary who played a great role in the fight against Covid -19."



UWEZO AWARD 2020 RESULTS, OUTCOMES & IMPACT

4.10 UWEZO AWARD 2020 results, based on objectives

- UWEZO AWARD 2020 reached 154 Secondary Schools of Dar es Salaam and Coastal Region (a total of 9 Municipalities and Regions), inspiring students to participate in Community Change Projects of UWEZO AWARD so that they can have a chance to learn/acquire practical entrepreneurship skills. The number of students in these schools are estimated to be 154,000+ as they have a have minimum of 1000 students, per school
- A minimum of 69 Community Change Projects (out of the total schools reached)
 were done by students in UA 2020. These being platforms for them to understand
 their potential/talent/ability, build skills around those potential, understand
 entrepreneurial opportunities around their Community and take advantage of them.
- Great Hope Foundation recognized 35 Community Change Projects in UA 2020 done by students that have qualified for recognition. 3 Gold Trophy for Outstanding Recognition, 14 Silver trophy for Great Achievement and 18 Bronze Trophy for Good Achievement.





- Great Hope Foundation has produced documentaries of Community Change Projects done by students in UWEZO AWARD 2018 and 2019 which are 30 in number. Some students from these schools had already graduated, and this hindered getting other 8 documentaries that needed to be recorded.
- UWEZO APP and WEB APP were developed as part of creating sustainability to UWEZO AWARD program. Students and the whole public shall stream UWEZO APP videos live through donation.

In the 2020-2024 strategy of UWEZO AWARD project the first objective is to increase number of Community Change Projects (20% yearly) done in Secondary Schools as platforms for them to understand their potential/ passion/drive/ability, build practical skills around that, understand entrepreneurial opportunity around their Community and capitalize. This has been fairly achieved as the number of Community Change Project increased 48 in 2019 to 69 in 2020, which is an increase of 43%, a bit above twice the goal we set.

The Second Objective was to increase (25% yearly) number of Community Change Projects recognized by Great Hope Foundation on UWEZO AWARD project. This objective has been fairly achieved. The number of Community Change Projects recognized increased from 22 in 2019 to 35 in 2020, making it an increase of 59%.

The third objective of UWEZO AWARD 2020-2024 strategy is to establish and increase number of programs that facilitate in making UWEZO AWARD project sustainable. In 2020,



Great Hope Foundation finalized the development of UWEZO APP (Android Version) and Web App that shall enable people to stream on their Desktops and Mobile phones, documentaries of winning Community Change Projects that shall also become a source of income to Great Hope Foundation. In 2020 year alone, GHF was able to record and document, 30 Community Change Projects from UWEZO AWARD 2018 and 2019.

Unfortunately, there was no progress on the fourth objective of developing a training, coaching and Mentorship Program for students who have come up with outstanding Community Change Projects that can be incubated and accelerated at the market place. This shall become a priority for 2021.




4.24 UWEZO AWARD 2020 ON TANZANIA 2015 EDUCATION POLICY

LESSONS LEARNT & CHALLENGES



Timeline for UWEZO AWARD 2020, was highly affected by Covid 19. The plan was to kick off the project in January and collect students' reports in August. However the unexpected closure of schools that came in Mid March to June, hugely affected the Timeline for UWEZO AWARD as well. This pushed the project to start in July up to October. Reports for all CCP were evaluated in November, that made UAC to be held in December.

On top of school closure, Covid 19, affected the readiness of students and school to participate in UWEZO AWARD. Many schools had developed tight schedule that eliminated time for any extra curriculum activities. Some schools, didn't participate giving this as their bottleneck.

Great Hope Foundation, couldn't fully accomplish objective that aimed at coaching and mentoring outstanding students' initiative that came out of UWEZO AWARD 2020. This was hugely challenged by insufficient availability of resources to kick off this program

HANCE SHISHA


